The Corps awards Phase 2 of the Fort Bliss, Texas Warriors-in-Transition Complex

FORT WORTH, Texas - The Corps' Fort Worth District awarded Phase 2 of the Fort Bliss Warriors-in-Transition Complex to FPM Remediations, Inc. of Rome, New York on June 25 for approximately \$11.1 million.

Phase 2 features an administrative building and a Soldier and Family Assistance Center issued under a HUBZone small business set-aside Multiple Award Task Order Contract.

The administrative building, a 30,000-square foot, two-story structure, will house a battalion headquarters and two company operations facilities. The administrative building will support staff functions of the recovering Soldiers.

The single-story SFAC, at approximately 15,000-square feet, will house a variety of support services. Services include counseling and social services, legal and financial support, and military benefits. The facility will also house a child activity center and Family Readiness Group meeting rooms.

"This project will play a big role in the recovery efforts of injured Soldiers and provide job opportunities to the local communities surrounding Fort Bliss," said Col. Christopher W. Martin, Commander of the Fort Worth District.

The project's first phase, awarded in May to Sundt Construction Inc., of Tempe, Ariz. for approximately \$30 million, consists of the barracks facility and site infrastructure.

The Fort Bliss WT complex is one of two being funded under the Recovery Act. The second WT complex will be a \$43 million facility to be constructed at Fort Campbell, Ky.
