U.S. Army Corps of Engineers announce Murrell Park Day Use Opening

FORT WORTH, Texas – The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will open the newly developed day use area of Murrell Park at Grapevine Lake on Tuesday, Aug. 31 at 10 a.m. during a ribbon cutting ceremony hosted by the Fort Worth District Commander, COL Richard J. Muraski, Jr.

In 2007 a day use area of Murrell Park became flooded and ultimately damaged beyond repair. Work has been completed to relocate ten day use sites, and is ready to be opened. Currently the day use area is free of charge and on a first come, first serve basis.
