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U.S. Army Corps of Engineers host public meeting to discuss Lower Colorado River Basin, Hays County Interim Feasibility Study

FORT WORTH, Texas – The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Fort Worth District, in partnership with the Lower Colorado River Authority, Hays County, and the Texas Water Development Board will host a public meeting in Buda, Texas on March 8 at 7 p.m. Meeting is being held to present preliminary hydrology and hydraulic results completed as part of the Interim Feasibility Study. The purpose of this study is to identify and investigate water resource related problems and opportunities, then develop and evaluate alternatives to reduce flood damages within Northern Hays County, Texas, watersheds, specifically Onion Creek, Bear Creek, Little Bear Creek, Barton Creek and the Pedernales River.

The meeting will be held at the City of Buda City Hall, 121 Main Street, Buda, Texas, 78610. Registration will be from 6:30 to 7 p.m., with the meeting beginning at 7 p.m. The meeting's agenda will include a formal presentation and a general question and answer session.
