LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION: The study area is located in Washington County, Texas, within the extra territorial jurisdiction of the city of Brenham. Brenham is located on Highway 290 roughly mid-point between the cities of Houston and Austin.

PROPOSED ACTIVITIES FOR FY 2007: We do not anticipate any funds allocation for this project in FY 2007, but funds carried over from FY 2006 are being used to coordinate with the sponsor, determine the extent of the erosion problems and initiate feasibility.

APPLICATION OF THE AMOUNT THAT COULD BE USED IN FY 2008: FY 2008 funds would be used to complete the planning and design analysis for this project.

ISSUES AND OTHER INFORMATION: The study area along Davis Creek is experiencing extensive streambank erosion that threatens the integrity of Old Chappell Road, a highly traveled concrete roadway. Closing of Old Chappell Road would be a major inconvenience for many residents and ranchers who would have to travel long distances on back roads to route around the problem area. In addition, closing of this roadway would pose a

potential health and safety hazard as a result of the extra time it would take safety vehicles to reach citizens living along this roadway in event of an emergency situation. The non-Federal sponsor is Washington County.

ADMINISTRATION POSITION: The Administration supports this project.
