LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION: The project area is within Garner State Park, which is operated by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and is located twenty-six miles north of the city of Uvalde in Uvalde County, Texas. The specific area of concern is along the right bank of the Frio River near a Civilian Conservation Corps built pavilion that is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.

ALLOCATIONS FOR FY 2005: We do not anticipate receiving any funds for this project in FY 2005.

APPLICATION OF THE AMOUNT THAT COULD BE USED IN FY 2006:
FY 2006 funds would be used to complete project construction.

ISSUES AND OTHER INFORMATION: Bank erosion occurring immediately upstream of the water treatment facility is threatening the intake structure. The recommended plan, which includes construction of a combination H-pile and sheet pile protective wall along the eroding river bank, was determined to be the least cost alternative that would address the erosion problem and meet sound engineering standards.

ADMINISTRATION POSITION: The Administration supports this study.
