

STREAMBANK EROSION PROTECTION

(Section 14 of the 1946 Flood Control Act, as amended)

PLANNING AND DESIGN ANALYSIS (PDA)

- Define the erosion problem
- Evaluate alternatives to prevent erosion
- Recommend a project for implementation if one is found to be technically and economically feasible, environmentally acceptable, and supported by a non-Federal partner
- Complete a project design, and the contract documents and drawings
- Execution of the Project Cooperation Agreement
- Non-Federal partner provides all lands, easements, rights-of-way, relocations, and disposal areas (LERRD's)
- Construction contract advertised and awarded
- Up to 12 months to complete (including real estate acquisitions), initially Federally financed

CONSTRUCTION

- Cost-shared between Government and non-Federal partner. Non-Federal partner contributes 35% of the total project cost (comprised of PDA costs in excess of \$40,000, LERRD's, construction, management) comprised of a combination of the value of any required LERRD's and cash.

PROGRAM LIMITATIONS

- Studies and projects are subject to the availability of Federal funds
- Assistance limited to protection of public facilities (road, bridge, utility, schools, hospitals, churches, non-profit organizations), and must be in imminent threat of damage or destruction from streambank failure. The Corps has no authority to protect private property.
- Total Federal participation in a study and project is limited to \$1.0 million
